The 2025 Hunter 350 is powered by Royal Enfield's dynamic 349cc J-series engine, renowned for its spirited performance and reliability. With its streamlined silhouette and signature blend of retro cues and modern styling, the Hunter 350 is perfectly suited to weaving through traffic or relaxing at urban hotspots.
